Our revised constitution has simplified the situation:

- Membership is open to anyone who attended King Henry VIII School, King Henry VIII Junior School, or King Henry VIII Preparatory School, Coventry.
- All former staff are eligible for Membership.
- Associate Membership is open to current staff and

any party with a connection to the Association or King Henry VIII School at the discretion of the Committee. Associate Membership could include parents, governors, descendants or spouses of former pupils, or former pupils of Coventry Preparatory School.



Hearsall Golf Day

On the 22nd April 2013, 29 players gathered at Hearsall Golf Club in Coventry to take part in the annual Old Coventrians Golf Day to battle it out for the Roy Burgess Cup.

A Stableford ¾ handicap team competition was the format with the best two scores for each hole counting. Players ranging from the class of 1960 up to the class of 2005 entered and formed teams of three or four players. In addition to the team competition, four individual competitions were held. The two nearest the pins on the 7th and 17th and two longest drives on the 9th and the 18th allowed players to step away from the team competition to try and take one of the individual prizes.



The Winning Team with a score of 85 points and winners of the Roy Burgess Cup in 2013 were Andy Brymer's team. Andy was in the Class of '70 and he and his team

were able to fit the competition in whilst travelling back home from a trip away. Nearest the pin on the 7th was won by Scott Dunlop Junior and to prove it wasn't a fluke he also won nearest the pin on the 17th! Scott travelled from Mexico to play in the Golf Day so I was pleased he won a couple of prizes to make his trip

worthwhile. Longest drive on the 9th was won by Andy Brymer's son, Tom who was a guest. Finally, Jon Arshad, one of my first friends at Henrys and still one of my best

Class of '92, '93 and '94 Reunion Dinner

There was a break with tradition this year, in that the Reunion Dinner for the Classes of '92, '93 and '94 on Saturday, April 27th, was held, not at the School, but at the Ramada Hotel in the Butts, where we were extremely well looked after and feasted on an excellent meal followed by coffee. Guests were able to relax, renew acquaintances and share memories before and after the meal at the hotel's well-stocked bar. So successful was the arrangement that a goodly number were, I believe, still conversing and reminiscing at about 4.30am! — by which time the organisers, being more mature in years(!), had made a tactful withdrawal!



80 diners attended the occasion, including 14 from the Class of '92; 8 from the Class of '93, including Jay Mattu (nee Mistry) and Rob Phillips, both of whom are now on the staff at King Henry VIII and are members of the Old Coventrians' Association Committee; and 14 from the Class of '94; it was attended also by 16 former members of staff (including former Headmaster George Fisher former Deputy Head Gethin Lewis with their respective wives), along with the present incumbent, Mr Jason Slack, and 5 current members of staff. It is worth noting that David and Sarah Hiett-Jones (nee Clough) – both of the Class of '93 – had formed a lasting union arising from their schooldays and Michael Nicholls ('92) and Hayley Cooper ('94) are set to do likewise: the Year Book of 1992 wondered 'when will Hayley Cooper become Mrs Nicholls?' The answer: Summer 2013!



For those who wanted to relive their schooldays or merely to see how the School has changed since their departure, there was the opportunity to meet at the Trevor Webb Sixth Form Centre at 2pm in the afternoon and receive a warm welcome from members of the OCA Committee, before embarking on a tour, after which refreshments were served. Almost all took advantage of this opportunity. It was easy to linger in the classrooms and recall how it had been in times gone by, as well as to admire the latest facilities, including the Art Block, Language Laboratory, Food Technology Room, new Archive Room and, of course, the Sports Centre and much anticipated and long awaited Swimming Pool!

After the dinner, Jan Butler (Chair, OCA) welcomed everybody, thanked all for coming — especially those who had come from as far away as Los Angeles (Alex Hawkins) and South Africa (Mark Garner) — and introduced the speakers: Robert Gregory ('92) spoke briefly and

movingly about absent contemporaries- James Bridgwood and then Tomasz Jennings, tragically killed while on military duty in Afghanistan in 2011. Tomasz's partner is planning an expedition to scale Mount Kilimanjaro to raise funds for the wives and families of soldiers killed in action.

The Headmaster reminded those returning of what had been happening in the wider world when they had all embarked on their School careers, and outlined how the School was continuing to aspire to and achieve the highest standards both academically and on the sports field! This was amply supported and expanded in some detail by

Head Boy, Sam Proctor, while Stephen Thompson ('94), Haneen Al Ibrahim ('92) and Mark Garner ('93) all regaled us with some amusing anecdotes about the School in the early '90s and various light-hearted character assassinations of their contemporaries!

All were agreed that it was a splendid occasion and a good move to combine recollections of School through the tours and to try a different venue for the dinner, with ample chance to catch up informally with what has happened to everyone since leaving School. Thanks must go to the Social Sub-committee for organising the event. Also, of course, to Jeff Vent, always fondly remembered, who provided the idea of and motivation for these Reunion Dinners. Those of us privileged to be able to attend all such reunions look forward to the next one — the Classes of '95 and '96 in 2014 — and hope to learn what has become of the next batch and to revive more memories with them!

Old Coventrians RFC (OCRFC) was founded in 1930 as the "Old Boys" of King Henry VIII School and played on leased pitches until 1985 when it purchased its current ground

which is situated in a prominent position at the junction of Tile Hill Lane/A45. Membership was officially restricted to former pupils of KHVIII until 1974 when in common with other old boys' sides it had to go open to survive. Today many club officers, some players and a large proportion of Vice Presidents are former pupils and the club retains the School crest. More players from the

OCRFC has 3 pitches at Tile Hill Lane, one with match grade floodlights and another with full training lights. The clubhouse contains changing and shower facilities for 6 teams, physio room, bar, large function room (for club events and outside functions) and a fully equipped kitchen, and can cater for up to 120 persons seated for hot meals. There is a separate weights room as well as pitches for flat and crown green bowls.
